"STOP! TAKE A CROSS HOME!," appears on the outdoor sign in front of the church. East Jordan members invite any and all to stop, get a cross, take it home and display it.

Attached to the cross is a plastic bag with a writing about the cross and a prayer for the people of Ukraine. We want to encourage people to pray with us for safety, care, love, and protection from the vicious killers of their freedom and families. We pray that our actions as Christians would encourage others to join in. Our members are building the cross, assembling the cross, painting the cross and planting the cross. So far, we have given over 200 crosses to people who have stopped by the church. We have received numerous phone calls, notes, text messages and posts of Thanks. We will continue to build the crosses and plant them in our lawn for all.

For 15 years we have reached out to the farming community in celebration of who they are. We call it: "The Farm Heritage Festival" This is where we invite local farmers young and old, to share with us their history, equipment, and practices. Our goal is to reach people outside, where they are at doing what they love to do and embracing them with our faith.
