Purpose: To encourage communication and coordination among Board of Church and Society ( $\P629 \& 657$ ), Board of Global Ministries ( $\P633 \& 656$ ), Commission on Christian Unity & Interreligious Relations ( $\P642$ ), Commission on Religion and Race  $\P634$ , Commission on the Status and Role of Women ( $\P644$ ), and the Committee on Native American Ministries ( $\P654$ )

Membership: For those bodies with Disciplinarily required membership, the provisions of the *Book of Discipline* shall be followed. If there are no provisions for membership in a body defined by the *Book of Discipline*, the membership will give attention to a balance of clergy, laity, gender, age, ethnicity, and districts.

The 2008 United Methodist Book of Discipline created flexibility for annual conference organization. Conferences were encouraged to streamline structures to create relevant, vital program ministries. Based on the Landscape Report (2015) and the ongoing work of the Annual Conference Shepherding Team (ACST), attention has been given to the creation of an organizational structure that would enhance the conference's focus on purpose, mission, and core values, while providing a forum for communication and coordination, reducing redundancy and providing more adaptability, flexibility, and productivity.

In 2020 the ACST formed a task force for reorganization of the program areas in the conference. The task force reported directly to the ACST as they worked. The task force included Mark

- 4 This task force reviewed the program ministries of the past decade and recommended the
- 5 retention of some areas, the consolidation of others, and the incorporation of areas that had
- become inactive or had a focus addressed by other existing boards, committees and task forces. 6
- 7 They then organized these committees, boards, task forces and groups in alignment with the
- 8 purpose, mission and core values of the annual conference.

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- 10 Committees that were retained and realigned are listed in the legislation. They include:
- Committee on Accessibility Ministries, Congregational Development and Redevelopment, 11
- Keagy Town and Rural, Latinx/Hispanic Ministry Team (National Plan), Conference Board of 12
- Higher Education and Campus Ministries, Older Adult Ministries, Outdoor and Retreat 13
- 14 Ministries, Conference Board of Laity, Committee on Spiritual Formation, Committee on Native
- 15 American Ministries, Board of Church and Society, Board of Global Ministries, Commission on
- 16 Christian Unity and Interreligious Relations, Commission on Religion and Race and the

Areas that were combined are: Children's Ministries, Youth Ministries, Young Adult Ministries,

Education Work Area and the Safe Sanctuaries Task Force into Young People's Ministries.

- Committee functions that have been incorporated into other existing areas addressing the same
- 23 work are: Evangelism into Congregational Development and Redevelopment; Committee on
- 24 Ethnic Local Church Concerns into Commission on Religion and Race; Restorative and
- 25 Transformative Justice to both Commission on Religion and Race and Commission on Church
- 26 and Society. In addition, Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century is now under the 27

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- This reorganization of the standing rules does not address a number of existing task forces and other committees that continue to function in the annual conference including the Anti-
- 31 Gambling Task Force, the HIV/AIDS Task Force and the Eco-Sustainability Network. Allowing
- 32 for the formation of task forces from time to time gives the conference flexibility in address 33 emerging needs.

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Caucuses such as Black Methodists for Church Renewal and Asian American Fellowship are not conference program areas and continue to exist outside the conference structure. Caucuses can apply for conference programming funds for their conference-wide ministry work.
