**David A. Ansell, M. D., M.P.H.**

is co-author of the article “Bias, Black Lives, and Academic Medicine” (Perspective, *The New England Journal of Medicine*, March 19, 2015) in which he cites systematic racial biases within academic medical centers that can influence clinical decisions as well as patient outcomes, medical education, and faculty recruitment.
