Evolving sense of humans and technology as coconstitutive

Evolving sense of people and technology as coconstitutive

 Considers moral formation in engagement with technology

 Relies upon values-based ethical approach

 Requires a commitment to critical digital literacy

How can we engage digital technology for the values we want to promote?

Hacking as a Christian ethic is ...

a socio-moral process

moves us from digital consumer to digital creator, citizen, or mediator

uses an adaptive, creative, and imaginative ethical response

attends to all (though not always at the same time) aspects of digital literacy

AI Impacts on Congregational Life

- Chatbots for pastoral care and evangelism
- Digital technology assistance for livestream or recorded worship and outreach
- LLMs for liturgical resources (visual and written).
- Assistance for managing communication and accessibility
- Research assistance for biblical interpretation, sermon writing, congregational assessment (trends)

Ethical considerations for AI use

Decreased human connection for some activities with increased time for other responsibilities

Environmental impact of AI

Biases in Al systems

Privacy and use of data concerns

Discernment related to the use of AI begins with identifying what theological and ethical values guide your ministry?
