# LOGISTICS

### Where will we stay?

Capitol Hill Hotel 200 C Street SE, Washington, DC Students will share rooms with other students.

#### Who can attend?

This seminar is designed for high school students entering 9th -12th grades. Participation is limited to 14- to 17-year olds. Leaders are background checked and nominated by the NIC. There is not enough space for additional adult participants.

### When is the trip?

We will depart on Wednesday, July 22 and return on Saturday, July 25. Students will need to be dropped off and picked up from the airport. Specific travel arrangements will be forthcoming after registration materials are received.

#### How Much does it Cost?

\$499 includes round trip airfare and in-city transportation, hotel accommodations, all meals, outings, tours, seminar speakers, and presenters.
