Leadership



Bishop John L. Hopkins, retired Bishop of The United Methodist Church, is serving as interim bishop in the Northern Illinois Conference for 2021. He was born in Montgomery, Alabama, and spent his childhood in Montgomery, Houston, Atlanta, and Ft. Wayne. After marrying Elaine M. Smithson in 1964, he attended Indiana University, receiving a B.A. with Honors in Psychology. He graduated from Yale Divinity School and was selected for the two-year Wheelock Residency at the Church of Christ at Dartmouth College where he practiced hospital, campus, and parish ministry. During this residency, he served as the Protestant Chaplain at Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital in Hanover, New Hampshire.

He was ordained deacon and elder in the North Indiana Conference. After serving a two-point charge in LaPorte, Indiana, Hopkins was appointed in 1976 as Wesley Foundation Director at Ball State University.

In 1983 he became Director of the Council on Ministries in North Indiana and, in 1989 was appointed in South Indiana as Senior Pastor at The Methodist Temple in Evansville.

He was elected to the episcopacy in July 1996 at the North Central Jurisdictional Conference and assigned to the Minnesota Area for eight years. In September 2004, Bishop Hopkins was assigned to the Ohio East Area until retirement in 2016. Bishop Hopkins was appointed by the Council of Bishops from 2004-2012 to serve as the first Chair of the Connectional Table which provides a forum for the understanding and implementation of the vision, mission, and ministries of the global church. During this time, Hopkins helped lead The Call to Action effort focused on increasing vital congregations around the world. He has served on the Executive Committee of the Council of Bishops, the United Methodist Publishing House Board, the General Board of Church and Society, the General Council on Ministries and the Committee for the Advance for Christ and His Church. Bishop Hopkins was instrumental in the formation of Operation Classroom in Sierra Leone and Liberia. His mission travel has included Angola, Mozambique, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Korea, China, Japan, Mexico, Bulgaria, Germany, the Philippines, and Vietnam. Currently, he serves on the board of Educational Opportunities, Inc. that provides scholarships for clergy to study in the Holy Land.

Bishop Hopkins and Elaine live in Indianapolis. They have three sons and seven grandchildren. Bishop Hopkins enjoys exercise, technology, kite flying, music, and guitar jams.

Bishop Tracy S. Malone was assigned to the East Ohio Conference of The United Methodist Church effective September 1, 2016. She also is currently the president of the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women, the secretary of the Council of Bishops, and is a member of the Board of Trustees of Africa University. Malone is the daughter of the late Rev. Willie and the late April Smith. She grew up in The United Methodist Church and accepted her call to ministry at the early age of 13.

During her ministry, she has pastored several churches in the Northern Illinois Conference, represented that conference at four General and Jurisdictional Conferences, served as a district superintendent and dean of the Cabinet. Malone received a Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies and Sociology, with a minor in Computer Science, from North Central College in Naperville, Illinois.

She holds a Master of Divinity from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois, where she was selected a Crusade Scholar, a Maceo D. Pembroke Scholar, and a Bishop Edsel A. Ammons Scholar. She earned her Doctorate of Ministry from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. Malone received the Distinguished Leadership Award from Chicago Black Methodists for Church Renewal in 2007, and was the recipient of North Central College's 2013 Outstanding Alumni Award. She received the 2016 Distinguished Alumni Award from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, and in 2018 received an Honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from United Theological Seminary.

She and her husband Derrick are the parents of two daughters.

that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments

contain all things necessary for salvation

through faith in Jesus Christ

and are the unique and authoritative standard

for the church's faith and life?

Response I am so persuaded, by God's grace.

Bishop Will you be faithful in prayer,

in the study of the Holy Scriptures, and with the help of the Holy Spirit

continually rekindle the gift of God that is in you?

Response I will, with the help of God.

Bishop Will you do your best to pattern your life

in accordance with the teachings of Christ?

Response I will, with the help of God.

Bishop Will you, in the exercise of your ministry,

lead the people of God to faith in Jesus Christ,

to participate in the life and work of the community, and to seek peace, justice, and freedom for all people?

Response I will, with the help of God.

Bishop Will you be loyal to The United Methodist Church,

accepting and upholding its order, liturgy, doctrine, and discipline, defending it against all doctrines contrary to God's Holy Word,

and committing yourself to be accountable with those serving with you, and to the bishop and those who are appointed to supervise your ministry?

Response I will, with the help of God.

Bishop Will you, for the sake of the church's life and mission,

covenant to participate in the life of the order into which you are ordained or commissioned? Will you give yourself to God through the order in order to sustain and build each other up

in prayer, study, worship and service

under the rule of life set forth in the vows you take this day?

Bishop May God, who has given you the will to do these things,

give you grace to perform them,

that the work begun in you may be brought to perfection.

The Examination of Persons Being Commissioned

Bishop By affirming the covenant of baptism,

all members of Christ's holy church pledge

"Ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest."

The Historic Questions

Bishop

As United Methodists, we are a people who journey together. Our baptism binds us together by both our common faith and diverse experiences. Together we walk in faith toward a world which is fully transformed by God's love.

Throughout our history, when we have gathered together to set people apart for the work of ministry as elder, and more recently as deacon, we have reminded ourselves of this shared ministry by asking the historic questions which John Wesley asked of all his preachers. And so today, we celebrate these which bind us together across time and tradition as we ask these who stand before us now:

Have you faith in Christ?

People Yes, by the grace of God.

Bishop Are you going on to perfection? And do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life and are

you earnestly striving after it?

People Yes, by the grace of God.

Bishop Are you resolved to devote yourself wholly to God and God's work?

People Yes!

Bishop Do you know the General Rules of our Church, and will you keep them?

People Yes, with God's help.

Bishop Have you studied the doctrines of The United Methodist Church and, after full examination, do

you believe that they are in harmony with the Holy Scriptures? Will you preach and maintain

them throughout your ministry?

People Yes!

Bishop Have you studied our form of Church discipline and polity? Do you approve them, and promise to

support and maintain them?

People Yes, by and with the grace of God!

Bishop Will you diligently instruct the children in every place? Will you visit from house to house, and

recommend fasting or abstinence, both by precept and example?

People Yes!

Bishop Are you determined to employ all your time in the work of God?

People Yes, by the grace of God!

Bishop Are you in debt so as to embarrass you in your work?

People No.

Bishop Will you observe the following directions? Be diligent. Never be unemployed. Never be triflingly employed. Never trifle away time; neither spent any more time at any one place that is strictly

necessary. Be punctual. Do everything exactly at the time. And do not mend our rules, but keep

them; not for wrath, but for conscience sake.

People With God's grace active in our lives and ministry, we commit ourselves to this way of life,

walking with one another toward the Kin-dom of God which we are called to create.

Celebrating the common ministry—the Oneness of God which permeates us all—in which we share, I ask those gathered here, will you re-commit yourself to the beauty and struggle, the mess and wonder of the life which we share together? Will you walk, will you run, will you work together in your words and actions, in your hopes and dreams, to be a people who transform the

world through your doing and being?

People With the grace of God to guide us, we covenant together now to walk with those whom God

has called, a people who travel together in unity and diversity, with love and humility, toward the Kin-dom of God. We recommit our prayers for and with one another, to be quick to

forgive and slow to condemn, as we walk together in faith.
