RECAP OF AWARDS TO LOCAL CHURCHES THROUGH THE CABINET

Groups and boards of the conference are to make application to a committee of the Shepherding team to receive a grant of these funds in 2020. Such an application involves specificity to the goals and methods of a project and details on how the funds are to be used. While awards have not been made for 2020, we provide information on the projects supported in 2018 and 2019 as illustrative of the types of work.

CHANGES IN STAFF SUPPORT

The 2020 budget contemplates another staff reduction following a staff reduction in 2019. The conference has made multiple contractions in staff over the years. We realize that many are unaware of the current levels of staffing relative to prior years. We have taken a conference organizational chart from 2006 and compared it to the staffing proposed in 2020. You will see on the chart the positions that were present in 2006 and continue to 2020, the positions that were present in 2006 and have been eliminated, and the positions that were present in 2006 that have been modified in some way or given a different portfolio. You will see the current level of conference staffing compared to prior years.
