5 6 Action:

- 7 The Northern Illinois Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church expresses outrage
- 8 with the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade and the adverse impacts this
- 9 decision will have on women, children, and youth throughout the United States.
- 10 The NIC calls on its congregations to have well-facilitated conversations about abortion care,11 prioritizing compassion over judgement.
- 12 The Northern Illinois Annual Conference secretary will send a copy of this resolution to each
- 13 member of the federal Congressional delegations that represent our annual conference region.

14 **Rationale:**

- 15 The United Methodist Social Principles (paragraph 161 K) state that "we are equally bound to
- 16 respect the sacredness of the life and well-being of the mother and the unborn child," and that
- 17 "we recognize the tragic conflicts of life with life that may justify abortion, and in such cases, we
- 18 support the legal option of abortion under proper medical procedures by certified medical
- 19 providers." The United Methodist Social Principles (paragraph 161 K) further state "the Church
- 20 shall encourage ministries to reduce unintended pregnancies such as comprehensive, age-
- 21 appropriate sexuality education, advocacy in regard to contraception, and support of initiatives
- that enhance the quality of life for all women and girls around the globe," and "a decision
- concerning abortion should be made only after thoughtful and prayerful consideration by the
- 24 parties involved, with medical, family, pastoral, and other appropriate counsel."
- 25 On June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court of the United States overturned Roe v. Wade which for
- 26 fifty years has given pregnant people in the United States the right and power over their own
- 27 bodies to choose, in consultation with their medical professionals, the best way forward when
- 28 facing difficult decisions regarding pregnancy.
- 29 It is a statistical certainty that people in our churches have themselves made the decision to
- 30 have an abortion or know people who have had abortions. Reduced access to reproductive care
- 31 disproportionately harms poor people and communities of color. In 1967, 21 clergy, including 6
- 32 Methodist clergy, published their names in the *New York Times* offering to help women find safe
- 33 abortions care at a time when abortions were illegal in much of the country, one of the first acts
- 34 of the Clergy Consultation Service, which eventually became a nationwide network of more
- 35 than 1000 clergy helping to save the lives of countless American women.

6 Action:

- 7 The Northern Illinois Conference of The United Methodist Church affirms that
- 8 apartheid is antithetical to the Gospel message. We recognize and oppose Israeli
- 9 apartheid as we strive to "resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they
- 10 present themselves," and
- 11
- 12 The Conference calls on the U.S. government to condition military funding to Israel

13 upon Israel's willingness to dismantle its apartheid system and implement all the rights

- 14 due to Palestinians under international law, and
- 15
- 16 The Conference urges all United Methodist clergy and laity to listen to the voices of
- 17 Palestinians regarding their situation, meet with them in their homeland, seek
- 18 opportunities to hear from them at online events. We urge UM clergy and laity to study
- 19 the Palestinian Christians' landmark 2020 document entitled "Cry for Hope: A Call for
- 20 Decisive Action," and to educate themselves on apartheid by studying the landmark
- 21 human rights reports, such as from Amnesty International. Links to these documents
- 22 may be found in the following rationale.
- 23

24 <u>Rationale:</u>

- 25 Israel is the sole governing power in most of Israel and the occupied territories. Israel
- 26 maintains primary control over most Palestinians' lives. Israeli authorities have
- 27 maintained domination over Palestinians by enacting a system of laws and policies that
- 28 grant full self-determination exclusively to Jewish Israelis and systematically oppresses
- 29 Palestinians. This is the essence of apartheid.
- 30
- 31 Apartheid is a "crime against humanity" under international law.¹ The primary
- 32 features of apartheid include:

- codifying into law a preferred group of people, giving that group preferential
- 2 access to resources, benefits and services,
- segregating the population into geographic areas based on identity, and
- establishing laws and policies designed to suppress opposition to the regime and
- 5 enforcing domination through arbitrary imprisonment, torture, cruel and inhumane
- 6 treatment, and other violations of human rights.
- 7
- 8 Israel has seized more than three-quarters of the land of its Palestinian citizens and
- 9 continues until today; Palestinians in the OPT have lived under Israeli military law for
- 10 generations without any protected civil rights.
- 11 If apartheid is to be opposed and abolished, it is essential for the international
- 12 community to recognize and name apartheid where it exists. The Social Principles of
- 13 The United Methodist Church state that United Methodists "commend and encourage
- 14 the self-awareness of all racial and ethnic groups and oppressed people that leads them
- 15 to demand their just and equal rights as members of society," and furthermore "call the
- 16 Church to challenge any hierarchy of cultures or identities."
