- Each of you as leaders that have dug deep into your spiritual gifts to build up the Body of Christ through your local church.

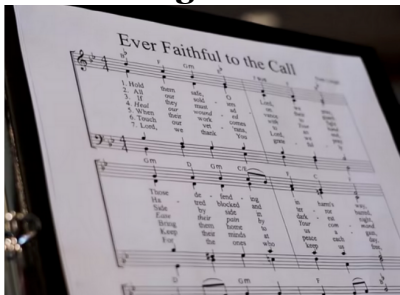
Whew! I think my waistline is already slimming. Friends, what do you give thanks for?

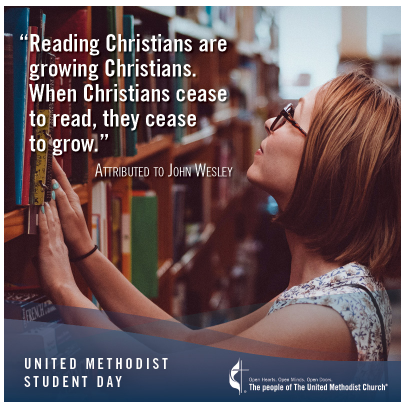

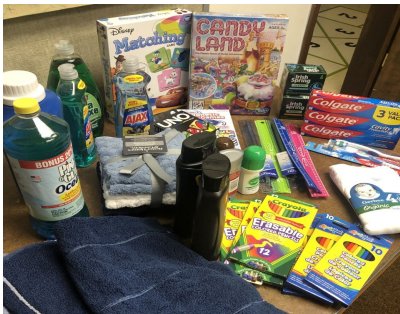


Special Sunday: United Methodist Student Day

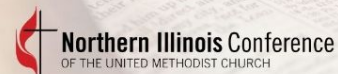
